CALL FOR NOMINATIONS 2020 - 21

The *Emmaus Australia Secretariat* is the governing body of Emmaus Ministries in Australia and consists of two representatives of each community, plus a few appointed members. It meets once a year, in the national conference normally held in April or May. The *Emmaus Australia National Board* (EANB) is the executive arm of the Secretariat and handles the month-by-month business of the movement on behalf of the Secretariat. Officers generally serve for a three year period.

The EANB is now calling for nominations for the positions of

- National Lay Director elect,
- National Treasurer elect

for a three year term to take office in 2021, and attend National Board Meetings (Zoom and in-person) and understudy the respective roles for the remainder of 2020 – early 2021.

It is preferable that nominees have held the positions as mentioned in the attached relevant job description in an Emmaus Community. They must have given their consent and, nominations must be endorsed by the Board of their own Community.

Nominations will close on Friday 8th January 2021

Job Description: National Lay Director

Short Description: The National Lay Director (NLD) is the leader and chairperson of Emmaus Ministries Australia, the Secretariat and the National Board.

Type: Secretariat Executive position

Reports to: Emmaus Ministries Australia Secretariat

Qualifications:

- 1. A committed lay person with a passion for the ministry of Emmaus Ministries at a national level.
- 2. Must have extensive experience as a Conference Room team member up to and including Walk/Flight/Encounter Lay Director; must have served several years as a member of an Emmaus Community Board.
- 3. Experience in management, leadership and group dynamics and team activities outside Emmaus is most desirable.
- 4. Must be an active member of his or her local church and of his or her local Emmaus Community, but should not be a concurrent CLD so as to minimise conflicts of interest and workload.
- 5. Must have ready access to the internet and be competent in the use of Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel and email.

Term of office: Three years; no more than two three-year terms may be served consecutively.

Duties:

- 1. Provide guidance to Community Lay Directors and Boards.
- 2. Encourage growth, development and sustainment of Emmaus Ministries in Australia and the surrounding region.
- 3. Facilitate annual Emmaus Ministries Australia Secretariat and regular Emmaus Australia National Board meetings.

Job Description: Treasurer

Short Description: This person maintains the financial records of the Secretariat and the Emmaus Australia National Board (hereinafter EANB), and keeps the EANB informed of the financial position.

Type: Secretariat Executive position.

Reports to: National Lay Director.

Qualifications:

- 1 Must have served as an Emmaus/ Chrysalis/ Face to Face Conference Room team member and as a member of a Community Board.
- 2 Must be an active member of his or her local church and of his or her local Emmaus Community.
- 3 Must have ready access to the internet and be competent in the use of Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel and email.
- 4 Should have some training or experience in accounting or bookkeeping.

Term of office:

Three years; no more than two three year terms may be served consecutively.

Duties:

- 1. Maintain accurate financial records for the Secretariat and the EANB in accordance with normal accounting procedures.
- 2. Report to each meeting of the EANB and the Secretariat the current bank balance and the receipts and payments since the last corresponding meeting.
- 3. Arrange to have the records examined at the end of each financial year and a report submitted to the EANB, and to the annual Secretariat.
- 4. Receive and record any offerings at Secretariat meetings and Conferences.
- 5. Receive record and bank all incoming funds; submit payments to the EANB for endorsement.
- 6. Receive and reconcile statements of any bank accounts, term deposits and the like held in the name of the Secretariat.
- 7. Communicate with Communities to remind them of their financial obligations with respect to the Secretariat.
- 8. Supervise the work of the Insurance Officer and act as the liaison person between that officer and the EANB.
