
We had two successful National Secretariat Zoom meetings last year and two virtual gatherings.

"A YEAR TO BANISH DISAPPOINTMENT!" Psalm 77

The difference between having confidence and lacking confidence can be the difference between success and failure, the difference between doors opening and doors closing. Confidence injects courage into us, lack of confidence sucks courage out of us.

Psalm 77 is a psalm about confidence.

I believe it brings a timely word to us all for all our communities.

The first nine verses of psalm 77 are complaints. We can go through a crisis of confidence in God and still believe all the right things about God. We believe generally, but struggle to believe personally at times – our mind says things like:-

I know that God is faithful, but will He be faithful to me?

I know that God is compassionate, but does He feel compassion towards me?

I know God's promises are true, but do they apply to me?

I think over these last two years Christians and our Emmaus communities have struggled with their confidence in God. Lack of confidence in God while holding onto our beliefs, keep us going in our faith walk; we still pray, but not with a strong confidence that God will hear our prayers and do awesome things; we still sing songs of worship, but we aren't moved the way we once were. Then as we continue to read this wonderful Psalm we read in verse 10 'a spark of confidence' can be seen this is a means to 'banish disappointment !' The **Psalmist** remembers what God has done, he remembers God's wonders of old, God's powerful work, His redemptive arm, and His mighty deeds in history he knows that all of history is God's history and God doesn't change. The God of then is the God of now! We are as much a part of God's redemptive history as the Psalmist was, as David was, as Joseph was, as Peter, James, and John were. God hasn't shrunk or moved or given up. Look at verse 14 in this Psalm 'you are the God who works wonders'. you were the God, you are the God! Now we see in the Psalm that confidence in God is rising!

Just as the Red Sea parted for the Israelites today is no different - God always makes a way for His people. I think the word confidence helps give us a understanding of what faith is. Faith is confidence in God: God will part the Red Sea.



God will make a way!

In Hebrews 4:16 the Word of God tells us what Jesus has done for each of us, Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need'. Don't go timidly, with many 'maybe's' - Open the doors and say, "Father, I'm here and I need mercy and grace!" Confidently! this pleases our Father's heart! It is time to 'Banish Disappointment' and the years passed that have brought disappointment – rise with confidence today for this year and beyond:

- · Pray confidently
- Meditate, repeat and learn the Scriptures with confidence
- Recount God's awesome deeds listen and speak actively
- Let's encourage one another to be confident in our great God and powerful Saviour Jesus Christ.

God is still great and powerful! He is still doing great things! We can believe that with confidence and pray that with confidence we can nay, we will 'banish disappointment' and move forward this year with expectancy that God is in control and His will be done in our lives and communities.

Please continue to join together on the 1st of each month to pray for Emmaus in our great nation of Australia.

National Secretary's Report

The Emmaus Australia National Board (EANB) has met four times since the 2022 Zoom Secretariat meeting in April – June, September and November 2022 and February 2023. In addition there was a Zoom meeting of the Secretariat in October; minutes of this meeting will be found in the Conference booklet. The main topics discussed included the new policy documents and the new program offerings from The Upper Room – Village Encounter and Fourth Day Restore. Presentations on these will be given at this conference. There were also some updated arrangements for the provision of Emmaus/Chrysalis supplies such as manuals & worship booklets.



As we emerge from the COVID-induced torpor of the last few years, seven Communities held Walks last year, and the curve is sloping upwards: at least nine are planning to do so in 2023. In addition Western Sydney is

planning to run the first Australian Village Encounter. We also have a new National Secretary, Peter O'Loghlin, a new Newsletter Editor, Mostyn Krollig, and a new National Chrysalis Coordinator, all appointed late last year. Still desperately needed are new occupants for the positions of National Lay Director, National Training Officer and ICT (Information, Communications and Technology) Coordinator.

Consequently, the National Board composition is as follows:

- ♦ National Insurance Officer Helen Drew

The new insurance cover, reported on last year, is proving effective. It includes both Public Liability and Volunteers cover, both rolled into one policy with a lower premium than we had been paying for the separate policies previously.

The Upper Room (TUR) has introduced a new reporting form to allow them to gain some feedback on the number of Butterflies and Pilgrims we are ministering to each year, so I will be contacting you periodically to gain those figures for your Community. I haven't been able to obtain full statistics for 2022 (HINT: CLDs, please return my calls or reply to my emails!) but it looks as though we had about 160 pilgrims last year.

It is Covenant time again! As you know, a condition of using any of the copyrighted materials from TUR is that all Board members read and sign the annual Covenant to use them in accordance with TUR's rules. The Covenant document was sent to all Communities on 17 February, and signed responses are due in today. Thank you to those who have brought or already sent them.

WHAT'S ALL THIS ABOUT A NATIONAL EMMAUS CONFERENCE?

Good question! It's a few years since we've been able to have one, so I don't blame you for asking! Here are few more questions you might like to ask.

FROM DARLING DOWNS EMMAUS COMMUNITY

What is it? It's the annual (well, usually!) get-together of all Emmaus Community members in Australia, and includes the National Gathering and the AGM of Emmaus Ministries Australia.

Do I get a vote? Well, the only part of the weekend where there is any voting is the AGM, usually an hour or two on Saturday afternoon. To keep it fair, each Community gets two votes, exercised by the CLD and CSD or their proxies.

When is it? Friday afternoon 31 March to Sunday afternoon 2 April 2023.

Can I come? Absolutely! In fact, all Community members are encouraged to come!

What if my Community is no longer functioning? No worries. If you have ever attended an Emmaus Ministries program, you are part of the wide Emmaus Australia Community.

What about Chrysalis, Alarga and Face to Face members? Yes, these are all part of Emmaus Ministries Australia. Members of other Fourth Day programs like Cursillo, Kairos, Tres Dias etc are also welcome as observers.

So what else goes on? Great fellowship, worship, teaching sessions, Communion, keynote speaker, ...

Keynote speaker? Yes! This year Hess "Doc" Hall, the International Lay Director, is coming out from The Upper Room HQ in Nashville, Tennessee. He will tell us about the new Emmaus ministries, and lots more.

New Emmaus ministries? Yep – such as The Village Encounter, Day Four Restore, and EMU – Emmaus Ministries University – all fabulous tools to help our communities stay alive.

And the Gathering? That's at a local church, on the Saturday night. Just like a Community Gathering, only bigger and better! Don't forget to bring your Community Banner for the parade.

Can I come just for the Gathering? Of course! If you can't stay for the whole event, come for the Gathering. But if you can stay for the whole weekend, you will find it really interesting and encouraging.

So where do we stay? Camp Koojarewon, Highfields – about 15 minutes north of Toowoomba. Accommodation (dormitory style) and all meals provided. It's a nut-free site, so you'd be nuts to bring anything (even chocolate!) with nuts in it.

What does it cost? Full time \$270, although many Communities pay the registration fee for their two voting delegates (CLD and CSD or their proxies). Also, those two can claim the cost of travel to and from the Conference from the EANB (Emmaus Australia National Board). Each Community pays an annual travel levy to the national Board, and this is used to cover those reimbursements and thus equalise the cost between those who live near and those who live far away.

What if I have my own accommodation? No problem. You just pay the day visitor cost of \$11 per day, plus \$17.25 for each on-site meal. Make sure you advise them on the rego form, which meals you want.

Emmaus Online Community Database

My name is **Paul Mulroney**, and I was a pilgrim on Perth Emmaus Walk #9 in 1999. I served on team for the first Great Southern walks, and the first Perth Chrysalis flights. Over the three communities I have served many times in various roles. My day job is development manager for **Logical Developments**. Logical Developments produces customised database solutions for small business across a range of industries including transport, manufacturing, and accounting/finance.

In all three communities that I've served in, I've noticed that each one had a community "database" consisting of an Excel spreadsheet to track member information. The team selection process used this to choose team members, extract email and postal addresses for newsletters etc.



There were always problems! If two people updated the spreadsheet, which one is the "master" copy? The spreadsheet isn't searchable in a meaningful way. For example: it can't easily tell us who hasn't served on team; or who was asked but they responded with "no"; or tell us how many times someone has served on team. Spreadsheets are flexible but it's too easy to delete data accidentally or enter nonsense data into the cells of the workbook. You can enter so many details, that your spreadsheet can end up looking something like this screen shot!

The biggest problem with Excel is this: Excel is not a database!

In 2015 I started working on a prototype online database system, and when I have had the opportunity to attend the National conferences in 2018 and 2019 I spoke with other communities and found that there were people who wanted such a system.

Logical Developments and Emmaus Australia National Board have an agreement in place to offer the community database to all Emmaus and Chrysalis communities in Australia, to help ease the administrative burden of managing the community's membership database. To date, 6 communities use the online database, and 17 communities take advantage of the online prayer vigil system.

In coming newsletters, I hope to share some of the features of the system, so you can see how it can make your life easier. Wouldn't it be good to be able to have the membership information that you need at your fingertips? Imagine setting up a prayer vigil with a literal click of a button!

If your community would like some more information on the system, or migrate their existing data onto the system – please contact me and I can arrange a zoom meeting with your board to demonstrate the system and answer any questions you may have.

Village Encounter Experience

Can you imagine a virtual walk that still has the impact of a cloistered environment? Can you picture an ALD from South Africa, Table Leaders from Zimbabwe, Great Briton, Australia, a ASD from Australia, an IT Technician from the Philippines all joining together with our brothers & sisters from the US for an Encounter with Jesus over three weeks. Now add Pilgrims from Kenya and USA, and a multitude of times Zones, all relying on technology. No, we relied on our amazing God.

Four members from Western Sydney Emmaus had the privilege to participate in such an event. And yes, the terminology changed. It was emphasised that it was not an Emmaus Walk, but a new and different offering in the suite of Emmaus's Ministries. We not only participated, but contributed to the ongoing development of this amazing program.

So, what is it all about? We saw the benefits as:

- Not limited to a geographical area
- Not limited to local Team Members or potential Pilgrims
- A modernising and perhaps a more relevant equivalent Emmaus Walk concept that met the current environment.
- Significant resource savings and certainly savings in expenses compared to a cloistered environment.
- A joint Men's and Women's program, that integrated both genders (Separate discussions in Chat Rooms)

- Teams were a proportional mix of genders which in effect halved the numbers required for an equivalent separate male and female walks
- The fundamental Emmaus Program was retained, but run over 3 Friday evenings, Saturday Mornings time periods with an Orientation session on the First Thursday evening. 15 Talks were presented in 10 minute segments.
